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### Abandonment: Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, County Tyrone

Dear Sir/ Madam,

This letter is my response to the Department for Infrastructure's notice of its proposal to abandon an area of 6170 square metres of road at Crockanboy Road Greencastle, Co.Tyrone, from a point 300 metres north-west of its junction with Mullydoo Road extending for a distance of 1118.5 metres in a westerly direction.

I became aware of the draft order for the above proposal in the Public Notices section of the Ulster Herald of June 23. 2016. I wish to object to this ridiculous proposal.

This is a proposal to abandon part of a road, known locally as the Green Road, which links the Mullydoo Road with a junction along the Gortin-Greencastle Road, a distance over 3km. In effect this is a proposal to abandon a road which has been in constant use for many generations over hundreds of years. It is really a proposal to close a through road. This closure will cause great inconvenience to all who use this thoroughfare; a route that has been used for hundreds of years. It was recorded on maps more than 200 years ago and it was actually one of the original Celtic Highway routes of Medieval Ireland.

Abandoning such an ancient route should not be contemplated especially as it is just as important today as it was all those years ago. Nowadays it has constant traffic. As with any other through road it is used by many locals. It is very popular with tourists as it commands great views of the scenic Owenreagh Valley and the summit of Mullaghcairn in this part of the Sperrins Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. It is equally attractive with locals who use it for recreational purposes including cycling, horse-riding and walking. As it is in such close proximity to the Greencastle Gaelic Football Club and Community Centre it is especially busy when sporting and social events are taking place in Greencastle GFC Complex. The abandonment of this road would be a great loss to our community. It would deprive us of an access route that originated in Medieval Ireland and has been in use ever since. It would remove the opportunity that visitors would have of experiencing one of the most scenic locations in the Sperrins or anywhere in Ireland. And very importantly it would deprive our community of the enjoyment of our own space.

This draft order is obviously linked to another equally ridiculous proposal by Dalradian Gold Ltd. to develop an ore-processing plant at the same location. To abandon this road and foist an industrial ore-processing plant are two totally outlandish proposals for this Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

In conclusion I request the Department for Infrastructure to withdraw the proposal for the Abandonment of Crockanboy Road, Greencastle, County Tyrone.

I wish to lodge an objection to the proposal of the Department for Infrastructure to abandon a section of the link road between the Crockanboy Road and the Mullydoo Road as advertised in the local press. There are a number of very important reasons why this proposal must not proceed:

- a. The need for more 'access to the countryside routes' has long been identified as a priority for this part of the Sperrins AONB. This section of roadway enables safe and convenient access for walkers, cyclists, runners and is used as a route for recreational and therapeutic horse riding.
- b. This section of public roadway is used regularly by farmers as part of their business and by service vehicles and should not be handed over arbitrarily to an external private interest.
- c. The Department may not be aware of the historical significance of this piece of roadway, in that it facilitates viewing and access to a section of an ancient Irish Slí or Highway. With the local Council's Tourism Strategy for Omagh Sperrins (AONB) this roadway presents a ready-made investment opportunity for a tourism package. Central to this is the story of O'Neill and his entourage journeying on this road en route to Rathmullan and on towards Spain on 14<sup>th</sup> September 1607, an event known as 'The Flight of the Earls'. The fact is that this month marks the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Great Earl Hugh O'Neill (28<sup>th</sup> July 1616).
- d. It is irregular for the Department to initiate proceedings to hand over this roadway and public right of way to a private interest as is being proposed in this case. Dalradian does not have planning permission for any proposed works on this site and is unlikely to get planning permission given the environmental risks associated with the proposed 'mine camp', gold mining and processing project as described by CEO of this Canadian company. It is premature and unreasonable for the Department to propose abandoning this roadway at this time.
- e. This area is in the Sperrins Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and the project being proposed by Dalradian is a t toxic and polluting business, unsuited for this site. It will damage the water in the Owenreagh and Owenkillew Rivers and their designated areas of special protection. The Department will need to consider the precedent of the Sandale judgement, 2013 NIQB 38, inter alia on these matters. Furthermore, the risks related to underground water systems and to the air must not be marginalised.



It takes them along a route of outstanding natural beauty. It would be an injustice to deny them this facility that has become their right.


The Crockanboy Hill Mass Rock, like all Mass rocks are places of worship for the Catholic population, this is only one of other Mass rocks in the Badoney Lower and Greencastle parishes. In the 17th century Catholics were forbidden to exercise their right to worship and priests were haunted by the political authorities of the time. Masses were said in private and hidden places in the hills and private homes. Priests were put to death to prevent Catholics from having access to the exercise of their faith. Masses were said in secret at Mass rocks and since then these places have been recognised as places of pilgrimage for individuals or parish groups. They are dotted here and there throughout the countryside. Masses are said at Mass rocks on special feasts or on special years, like this year, designated as "The Year of Mercy' by Pope Francis. Today Masses are said at Mass rocks only infrequently but they have become part of our Catholic tradition.

There is no alternative route in the area that could be used for this purpose

The loss of this route will cause significant difficulties for our parishioners to access this sacred space for the purposes of prayer for many years in the past and in the future and will be a huge loss to our Parish and wider Community.

I wish to place on record that I received no notification of the proposal to abandon this road and I have been sufficiently prejudiced by not being made aware of the draft order. My objection should still be accepted and considered.



# Proposed abandonment at Mullydoo Road, Greencastle

We refer to the above proposed road abandonment. We act for a number of local residents who will be impacted by loss of access via this road and object to the proposal.

We assume that the purpose of the proposed abandonment is to facilitate proposals by Dalradian Gold Ltd for its processing plant on the lands surrounding the Mullydoo Road which it would appear will lead to the loss of the road.

At this stage, Dalradian's proposals are no more than that, no formal planning application has been submitted and according to Dalradian's published information, any application that is made will be in the Autumn of 2016 at the earliest following further extensive consultation. This being the case, the proposed abandonment is highly premature and cannot be justified in any rational or lawful sense.

Under the Roads (NI) Order 1993 Order (the "1993 Order") the Department must not make a stopping up order unless it is satisfied that that the road is not necessary for road traffic or that another road is available which provides or is capable, if improved, of providing alternative facilities for road traffic. At this stage, as noted above there is no rational justification for loss of the road given that no proposal to develop the land exists.

In any event, our clients object to the proposed abandonment due to loss of access and use of the road and in particular access to surrounding farmland and lands for the utilisation of turbary rights for which no alternative access is available.

We also note that our clients became aware of the proposed abandonment through being passed a letter to Omagh and Fermanagh District Council. No notification has been provided to a number of properties in the local area where residents would utilise the road and will be prejudiced by its abandonment. In issuing the notice of the proposal it appears that TNI has not fully consulted with local residents in order to understand the implications of the proposed

abandonment. Please confirm that the notification requirements set out in Schedule 8 paragraph 1 of the 1993 Order have been complied with and provide details of what action was taken by TNI to comply with these requirements. Further under paragraph 2 of Schedule 8 the Department is required to give and publish such additional notices as it considers appropriate for informing all persons likely to be adversely affected by the modification. This requirement clearly has not been complied with and therefore the notice and proposal are fundamentally flawed.

Notwithstanding the flaws in notification as outlined above, TNI must, under paragraph 4 of Schedule 8 to the 1993 Order cause a local inquiry to be held in light of the objections lodged in this correspondence. We also understand that at a recent meeting of Omagh and Fermanagh District Council, a significant majority of Councillors voted against the stopping up, which adds substantial weight to the need for a local inquiry and to fail to do so would be a manifest breach of the requirements of the 1993 Order. However, this element of the process cannot lawfully be undertaken until the flaws in TNI's initial advertisement and notification of the proposal are first rectified.

Our clients are extremely concerned that this highly premature action by TNI is also indicative of predetermination by the Department towards the proposal by Dalradian Gold. This will impact upon the legality and integrity of any determination made by the Department of the Environment in relation to Dalradian's proposal as and when a formal planning application is made.

In light of the above we request that TNI provides a detailed response in relation to our client's concerns and also sets out how it believes that it has complied with the requirements of the 1993 Order both in terms of justification for this proposal at this time and complying with the notification procedures.


