I will not have sight of any unsolicited material submitted to the Commission which I have not requested and the Programme Officer will return it to the sender.

Once completed, my report will be sent to the Department for Infrastructure. It will concentrate on reaching clear and reasoned conclusions on the plan's compliance with the statutory requirements and its soundness as well as presenting recommendations on any amendments to the plan which are required to overcome any correctable shortcomings in relation to these matters. Paragraphs 37-41 within the Commission's 'Procedures for Independent Examination of Local Development Plans' document (December 2019) provides further information on the report and is available on the Commission's website.

The Department will be required to consider the Commission's recommendations but will not be obliged to accept them. As there are a considerable number of matters to consider, it is my intention to deliver the report to the Department by mid October 2022. If the report is completed before that time it will be forwarded earlier. The Commission's Examination Library will be updated accordingly and a news item will be posted on the website's homepage. Release of the report will be a matter for the Department.

The Programme Officer, Mr Barry Fegan, will remain available to deal with any queries that may arise.

I would like to thank all participants for their valued contribution to the discussions; this is very much appreciated, and it has been a pleasure to conduct this examination. I am also indebted to Mr Barry Fegan for his invaluable assistance in preparing for and carrying out the various hearing sessions as well as to Mr James Bickerstaff who has provided additional technical support.
