All of Belfast Hills not open space in terms of accessibility – suggestion that area is marked as a Significant Natural Heritage Asset with open spaces marked individually.	Comment noted. The BOSS is not a planning policy document and focuses only on land whereas PPS8 covers all open space of public value including bodies of water. It should also be noted that in the future PPS8 will be superseded by the LDP.
