

Massive, sandstone, 6-7' high, shaft 1' wide, + circ. solid head 2-4" diam. Above this,
shaft projects 7", + v. short arms only inch or so.

Clear never find. peal :: Flaw visible clearly on W. side.

West: guide lines, + central boss begun.

East: lines lightly incised for ringhead, w curved angles at intersections.

Surf. N & S. + ends of arms plain.

Preliminary Survey 1940.

p.254 St. Kieran's church - rect., c. 60' x 20', perh. older in N. wall. S. are carved door jambs. Thought to be Francisc. ^{fr. 1489} but this may have been at Ballynasaggart where believed abbey stood pre 1622 building of Old Ch. (aband^d. 1832). In modern ch. 2 fonte, lower inverted + upr. perh. 17th. Lower perh. fr. E. Keerogue or the Friary.

TRACES OF A ROUND TOWER.

To W. of church - CROSS, solid ring, arms only slightly projecting, faces N., rough, early slight traces of ant. Wreathed boss & sq. base $\frac{1}{4}$ circ border. 6 ft. grad. Top 12" x 7". At Favour royal is carved head w. broken base. V. flat sculpt. nose + eyes outlined. + ears project slightly, appar. crown round forehead. Believed fr. E.K. where it stood over St K's well. Poss. ang. canopy for cross - tho' dimensions slightly larger.

Name, earlier form "Ariagal Dachiarog": ch. & D. - evidently Celtic shrine here. Said 1489 Con O'Neill estab^d. Francis. Friary in area. V. primitive cross, poss. transition type fr. pillar stone to carved cross. Nothing of archit. left in ch. wh. is v. ruined.

H VIII St. P commanded St Marathan to build mowr at royal seal of Eirgall. Dec^d stae less kil green sewer as riding post for cattle. Was the cover of a vault of flat stones set edgeways. 2 will w. ashes found inside.

Ch. ruin, not good work. Cross "totally unornamented,"

RC^d Sung here + well they considerably, services formerly held here occas^s.

Grape Hill tree appears : may have + it pointed out but no budgs + can learn nothing about it.

Battisaggard St. Franc. Friday p. 185 "...The fells of a round tower were to be seen there within ten years, but now, even the ruins have disappeared."

Present ch. fr. new church. Irak - burnt place fr. Fomass but not in memory. Local hoods re St Kieran - 3 saints this name. Well cures.

Folly objects ① Cleg of Tenna - old bell. said found in ruined ch. T. maguire par. No tongue. Kept in par. Tenna map. ② Dough - casket kept in. Bracken ^{want pink} part of the ③ Belagh d'Kearney - larger box w/ concave rounded sides - book of DL - said fd ch Tedavnet. Kept Knockbeg in Monaghan. All kept by hered's keeper.

Site - fine open wth valley to S. SW & SE. hills to N. A lump of graveyard around. Hilltop - has seen esp. well he is where new flatter ground like a more recently for burials.

Condition - fairly good.


Church - v. dense ivy, much fallen stae. + much stae around grys in general. No sign of reported round tower.

Cross - W. of NW corner of old church. Strange appearance. very flat + wide with stumpy arms, but v. likely is unfinished. W. side central flat boss inside a square of setting-out lines. These lines in line with shaft but not with arms. Chip on dr. part shaft NW corner - looks like sandstone. Quite heavy lichen. Side view seems to thin considerately towards top. Sides plain.

Note flared stae on S. side above arm. E. side - ring marked out, esp. $\swarrow \searrow$ lines seem to run out to arms. But much lichen, slight for me not good. Is a massive hunk of stae.

Well - on other side of road in hedge to East.

Could do with better photo of East side & look for arms on E. w/ hollowed arms.

1. 10. 66 another visit just miss light on East face of cross. Can see arms to South carved thus  but thick dark lichen + v. difficult to see. On N. side easier trace of hollowed arm (lower) But cert'ly can't see all that th claims.

West side again very clear - marked out lines, see sketch + photos.

Can see quite deep down (at) of shaft on West - total ht. c. 6' 10".
